

Description

PEP (job number 1258) was completed for the 1967 Sydney Boat Show as a display vessel for the Halvorsen stand. It was sold at the show to HC Pepper, hence the name PEP. PEP is 7.62m (25 feet) long and has a vee-bottom hull form typical of a speedboat of the era. Halvorsen's built a small number of this design in the mid 1960s for private buyers. It features a small forepeak with Vee bunks and head, a covered helm and seating position, which opens out to a long open cockpit aft. It is an ideal harbour recreational craft for fishing and cruising, and has a simple but elegantly proportioned profile. Like most Halvorsen boats, the hull is white and the superstructure varnished. PEP has a cold-moulded hull with two layers of oregon planking. The original engine was a 308 cu. in. V8 Mercruiser, a powerful motor for a small craft and its planing hull has a maximum speed of about 26 knots. In 2008, after 40 years of continued use PEP remained in good condition, although the owner planned to replace the original engine.
